Why Do We Need Aggregates?

- Fresno County's aggregates industry supplies sand, gravel, and crushed stone for local construction. Millions of tons of aggregates are required to build and maintain our infrastructure: roads, highways, homes, buildings, schools, and public works.
- Investing in infrastructure improves quality of life, attracts new industries, generates economic benefits, and enhances community livability.

Economic Impacts

- The combined annual impact of the construction and aggregates industries in Fresno County is **\$4.4 billion**.
- Construction and aggregates contribute over **8%** of Fresno County's \$35 billion output, comparing favorably with other leading industries, such as transportation and wholesale trade, and fruits and fruit processing.
- The county's major industries use **\$430 million** of aggregate and construction's goods and services. The industry sectors of finance, insurance, and real estate as well as transportation, communications, and public utilities, have the greatest need for construction and aggregate products.
- The construction and aggregate industries employ **6%** of the county's workforce.
- The aggregates industry pays an average wage of **\$45,137** – nearly triple the county's per capita income.
- The construction and aggregate industries pay nearly half a billion dollars (**\$494 million**) in federal, state, and local taxes.
