


CALOSHA Mining & Tunneling Units



CalOSHA's - IMMEDIATELY REPORTABLE

▶ §342. Reporting Work-Connected Fatalities and Serious Injuries.

(a) Every employer shall report immediately to the Division of Occupational Safety and Health any serious injury or illness, or death, of an employee occurring in a place of employment or in connection with any employment. The report shall be made by the telephone or through a specified online mechanism established by the Division for this purpose. Until the division has made such a mechanism available, the report may be made by telephone or email.

Immediately means as soon as practically possible but not longer than 8 hours after the employer knows or with diligent inquiry would have known of the death or serious injury or illness. If the employer can demonstrate that exigent circumstances exist, the time frame for the report may be made no longer than 24 hours after the incident.

- ▶ §330. Definitions.
- (h) "Serious injury or illness" means any injury or illness occurring in a place of employment or in connection with any employment that requires inpatient hospitalization for <u>other than medical observation or diagnostic testing</u>, or in which an employee suffers an amputation, the loss of an eye, or any serious degree of permanent disfigurement, but does not include any injury or illness or death caused by an accident on a public street or highway, unless the accident occurred in a construction zone.

WHAT WE'RE SEEING!

§334. Classification of Violations and Definitions.

► The amendment to Section 334(d) was finalized in September 2016 and now states that a violation is defined as a violation when the employer "has abated or indicated abatement of an earlier violation" occurring "within the state" of a "violation of a substantially similar regulatory requirement" and within "five years" of receipt of the citation. So, a Repeat violation no longer must be of the same violation, but only one that is of "essentially similar conditions or hazards." The repeat is no longer limited to a Cal/OSHA region, but now can be anywhere in the state. 1st repeat - the Proposed Penalty is multiplied by two.
